Mission Sunday

This Sunday, October 20 is World Mission Sunday. The 2nd Collection/Share Collection is replaced by the collection for the Pontifical Missions Society at Masses this weekend. World Mission Sunday is the Holy Father's annual appeal for spiritual and financial support so that the life-giving work of overseas mission and missionaries can continue. It always falls on the second last Sunday in October, and like the Good Friday collection for the Holy Land and Peter's Pence, it is one of three yearly universal Church collections. Bishop Donal Murray 1940 - 2024

He was ordained as Auxiliary Bishop of Dublin and Titular Bishop of Glendalough on 18th April 1982, and served in that role until his installation as Bishop of Limerick on 24th March 1996. In December 2009, he resigned as Bishop of Limerick, out of his sense of the needs of the survivors of abuse, and of the Church in Ireland as a whole. This decision necessitated both courage and strength. Like Christ, he was more concerned about the little ones, the most vulnerable, than about himself, his reputation, or his position. As Bishop of Limerick he was an agent of change and put the best safeguarding practices in place in the Diocese. By doing so he greatly lowered the risk of further abuse in the Church.

Voices From the Synod On Synodality

"Sister Gloria Liliana Franco Echeverri, president of the Latin American Confederation of Religious Men and Women, said that the assembly's reflections "place before us the action of Jesus", the evangelical values and style that must permeate Synodality. She highlighted the need for meaningful formation based on committed witness, undertaken with others in a way that "allows us to adopt the style of Jesus". She spoke about discernment, which offers the possibility of determining what the Holy Spirit is asking of the Church. To this end, she emphasised the importance of participatory structures throughout the Church."
